## Vintage 19 sixtyone

The vintage 1961 is a legendary one. That all starts with the perfect growing season and harvest. The spring frost conditions naturally reduced crops, lowered yields and concentrated the already intense flavors. The spring was actually mild which led to an early and even flowering. The summer was for the most part, warm, sunny and dry. But in July, the summer rain fell provided exactly what the grapes needed, then an extremely hot and dry August. Followed by a close to perfect September, which was still warm and dry. These conditions produced small, ripe, sweet, thick skinned berries, with almost unseen levels of concentration of intensity and flavor. The 1961 harvest started the 22nd of September for the Bordeaux. This is quite similar to what happened in 1945.

Pinot noir is the most important grape variety due to the cool climate there; it makes attractive and well balanced red. Characterized by a fruit-driven and full bodied in its style, with hints of oak and a touch of vanilla, also some earthly flavors in the best Pinot noir. Central Otago is the southernmost vineyard in the world where the Pinot noir is a real rival to a French Burgundy.
